The role of Head of Programmes

The role involves taking full responsibility for the delivery, design and evaluation of our programmes.

The successful candidate will play a key role in developing our programme management to improve the consistency and quality of delivery as we increase our reach. Having recently commissioned our first impact evaluation, we are now looking at developing our internal monitoring system and conducting an implementation and process evaluation across 2020/21 programme year.



Main Responsibilities

The Head of Programmes is responsible for ensuring that Future Frontiers develops and delivers programmes of the highest quality and consistency across the UK.

Managing our programmes team – we currently have two experienced programme officers who deliver the programme in schools and businesses. Your will manage this growing team of Programme Officers, providing support and setting expectations for delivering results. You will also have responsibility for managing your own programmes across a number of schools and businesses which will be appropriately balanced with your capacity needs for managing an expanding department.

Develop effective systems for efficient and programme management – Key to our plans for scale across the UK is a complete review of our current systems for programme management, volunteer management and programme scheduling.

Coach training and support – You will coordinate the development and delivery high quality training to coaches, whilst developing new tools for the ongoing support and guidance.

Lead coach training and development – Our lead coaches are experienced coaches who are there to support each programme. You will develop a strong framework of lead coach selection, training and management to ensure effective programme delivery.

Managing school relationships – You will build and maintain long standing relationships with all Lead Teachers at participating schools. This will include the initial planning meetings with all new and existing schools.

Programme monitoring – You will develop and implement monitoring tools to measure programme success at pupil, coach and school level. You will identify trends in programmatic success and champion new ways to improve our existing provision.
